+ THE LORD'S PRAYER

C: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever and ever. Amen.

One of the greatest gifts that God has bestowed upon mankind is prayer. However, this wonderful gift is one that has often been neglected by many Christians. We often forget the power of prayer and the effects it has on us as individuals and as members of the "Body of Christ."

The first mark of discipleship is to pray daily. Daily prayer is the foundation of a healthy Christian life and is most definitely a very vital means of becoming and remaining a follower of Christ Jesus. Often we just don't know how to pray, but fortunately for us Christ taught his disciples at their request a model prayer that is most familiar to us all, "The Lord's Prayer". We pray this prayer most every week, however, we seldom take time to reflect on these words of Jesus to us and what they mean in today's context.

The first words of "Our Father" remind us of just who we are addressing. They also remind us in the Post-Modern world that God the Father is the creator of us and that we are mere creation. In our Post-Modern world the pattern is to flip this relationship and let our experience dictate just who God is and what the parameters we will accept from Him are: thus, flipping the roles and mankind taking on the role of creator and God taking on the role of creation. Sounds crazy right, but this is exactly what we do when we fail to let God be God and except our role as creation.

"Who Art in Heaven" again, reminds us of who we are addressing and His place in the cosmos. God resides in the spiritual and perfect sphere and we reside on the earth surrounded by the imperfect and by sin and death.

"Hallowed be Thy Name" The Father is holy. He is to be praised and glorified merely because of who and what He is. As we begin to pray we should always enter it with praise, thanksgiving and supplications to the Father and His holy Name.

"Thy Kingdom Come" God's kingdom is something we should desire and pray for its entrance into our world of imperfection and sin. Jesus has said, "the kingdom of God is in your very presence." 'The Kingdom of God is very near to you." You see the kingdom of God is not this far off place that we long for, that is Heaven God's residence. The kingdom of God is Jesus Christ. He represents all that the kingdom of God is and has for its people. Jesus lives a life according to how the Father desires all to live and His very Son Jesus Christ is the model of the kingdom.

"Thy Will Be Done" Prayer is a time to seek God's will and not our own. All too often in prayer we only think and seek for what we desire and the outcomes we want. Again, we must defer to the Father and His desires and His will over our own. God's plans and desires are right for us and will never leave us wanting or in lack. God's will for us will only lead to happiness, joy and the "life more abundantly" Jesus came to provide for us.

"On earth as it is in heaven" God is concerned with earth. The Father sent His Son to earth so that His will might be done here. The Father desires that none would perish so He sent Christ to redeem all through His sacrificial work on the cross. The Father also sent His Son as THE example of truth, morality and righteousness for all of humanity to follow. Christ calls all of His people to become disciples (followers) of His example of how to live on this earth. By following Christ in every aspect of our lives we are doing Gods will here on earth.

"As it is in heaven" heaven is Gods dwelling place and the epitome of perfection. He desires this state of existence for His creation here on earth although this will not be a utopia of human making, but will ultimately be ushered in by Christ Himself at the last day.

"Give us this day our daily bread" isn't it interesting that Christ gives only one line to our daily needs as humans when we seem to spend every waking moment worried about our physical needs. This does not mean that we should not plan for the future or store up for a rainy day. However, this should not be our focus or primary worry. God knows what we need and has promised to provide those needs. After all, He is our creator and as such knows exactly what our needs consist.

This also has a dual meaning. We are to seek all of Christ each day as he is "The Bread of Life".

"Forgive us our trespasses" Christ has removed the barrier that our father Adam set between God and man. We can now go boldly to our Father in heaven, with Christ as our mediator, and ask for forgiveness of each and every one of our sins knowing with confidence that He is willing to forgive us every time we come to Him.

"As we forgive those who trespass against us" God has forgiven us of so much and in like manner we need to forgive those who have wronged us. By doing this we are following Christ's example of forgiveness and are truly His disciples. Christ throughout His ministry and primarily in His parables has explained this to us. Also, by forgiving others Christ has told us that the Father forgives us. If we who have been forgiven so much cannot forgive those who have harmed us then the Father (Christ's words) will not forgive us or hear our prayer.

"And lead us not into temptation" we need to pray that God will direct us away from all things that will lead to our detriment. God does not tempt us, however, in His knowledge He ultimately knows what the future holds. We are to pray, God will lead us into His paths and not those we or the enemy (Satan) have devised. These paths lead to destruction, but Gods to life, peace, truth and finally to everlasting life.

"Deliver us from evil" again, God knows what is best and we in our limited knowledge do not. We need to pray that the Father will guide us from the evil that Satan and his kingdom would set upon us. God is our shelter against every storm and our strength. We rely on God's understanding and not our own.

"For thine is the power, and the glory, forever and ever," this ending is one that reminds us who has all power and who all glory belongs and that would be the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. The ONE God who is everlasting.

"Amen." Means truly or I concur. This states our agreement with all that Christ has given for us to pray for and about.

IN HONOR OF JESSE AND SERVING OUR VETERANS

When the Ours family joined us at First Lutheran in Pontiac on 1/1/2020, we learned the story of Jesse Ours, his service in the Army, his experience in Iraq and the pain he suffered mentally from that. In his service he paid for our freedom with his life. Since that time we have broadened the focus of our church mission efforts to serving veterans in honor of Jesse. To that end, for two years we had Jesse's Ride for PTSD and last year, in lieu of the ride, we began taking advantage of a program offered through RADA Cutlery which allow us to raise funds from sales from their catalog. With these funds we have donated gift cards for groceries and essential supplies to our Livingston County Veteran's Office, as well as sent a donation to the "Lutheran Military Veteran's and Families Ministries, Inc. in Fort Wayne, Indiana. Additionally, we have supported the LCC Comfort K-9's AND the Pontiac Jr High comfort dog, Mason who is handled by school counselor Marci Hunt.

Since 1948 RADA Cutlery, all made in the United States, gives a significant portion of their sales profit back to the sponsoring group in fundraising. Purchases are made online using our First Lutheran Church link, then our profit will be shared with our designated recipients.
